

**RURAL MUNICIPALITY OF NORTH NORFOLK
BY-LAW NO. 700/02**

BEING a by-law of the Rural Municipality of North Norfolk respecting the transportation of waste within the municipality

The Council of the R.M. of North Norfolk in session assembled enacts as follows:

For the purposes of this by-law the following definitions should apply:

1. DEFINITIONS

- (a) Construction Waste shall mean any material used in the site preparation, assembly, erection, substantial repair, alteration or similar action, but excluding demolition, for or of public or private rights-of-way, structures, utilities or similar property.
- (b) Demolition waste shall mean any material from dismantling, interior destruction or removal of structures, utilities, public or private right-of-way surfaces, or similar property.
- (c) Household waste shall mean any waste material other than construction, demolition or industrial waste.
- (d) Industrial waste shall mean the material from manufacturing, commercial or industrial processes and facilities.

2. (1) The owner and the operator of a motor vehicle, load container, or trailer being used to transport construction, demolition, household or industrial waste on a public road or highway within the Municipality must ensure that the waste is either:

- a) entirely enclosed within the motor vehicle, load container or trailer, or
- b) covered with a covering that is made of tarpaulin, canvas, wire mesh, netting or other material capable of confining the load within the motor vehicle, load container or trailer.

(2) A covering referred to in subsection (1) shall be secured to the vehicle in such a manner that neither the covering nor any part of the load will be separated from the motor vehicle, load container, or trailer.

3. OFFENCE AND PENALTY

Any person(s) who contravenes this by-law is guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to:

- (a) A fine of not more than \$500.00, or in default of payment to imprisonment for not more than 30 days.

4. All fines and costs imposed on a prosecution under this By-Law, are a debt owed by the offender to the municipality and may be recovered by the Municipality in a court of competent jurisdiction or may be collected by the Municipality in the same manner as a tax may be collected or enforced under *The Municipal Act*.

5. This by-law shall come into force and effect forthwith after the passing thereof.
